Brethren,



47th Problem of Euclid

Masonic Education

[Editor's note: The author of this article is unknown; the article is signed "Masonic Education" but does not even disclose from which Grand Jurisdiction it came. We reprint it here because of its value to the Craft, with full appreciation and attribution to the unknown Brethren who provided it.]

The 47th Problem of Euclid, also called the 47th Problem of Euclid or the Pythagorean Theorem, is represented by 3 squares.

To the speculative Mason, the 47th Problem of Euclid may be somewhat mysterious. They may see this symbol on Masonic certificates or on Masonic cufflinks and lapel pins. Most Masonic books simply describe it as "a general love of the Arts and Sciences". However, to leave its explanation at that would be to omit a subject which is very important to the Masonic Square.

What are these three black boxes and why are they important to Freemasons?

We are told that Euclid (father of Geometry), who lived several hundred years after Pythagoras, worked long and hard to solve the 3:4:5 ratio puzzle. It is said by some that he then sacrificed a hecatomb (a sacrificial offering to God of up to 100 oxen or cattle). However, historically, it is believed that the Egyptians and the Babylonians understood the mathematical usefulness of the 3:4:5 ratio long before Euclid. The math is the key to understanding this symbol's broader and universal meaning.

47th Problem or 3:4:5

In any right angle, the sum of the squares of the two sides is equal to the square of the hypotenuse (the hypotenuse of a right triangle ... which is the longest leg ... or the "5" side of the 3:4:5). The right triangle, below, shows the sides of 3, 4, and 5. The angle created between the 3 (side) and the 4 (side) is the right angle of the square.

A little later, when we begin to build it (with sticks and string), you will place your sticks at the three corners of the right triangle.

The square of 3 is 9. The square of 4 is 16. The sum of 9 and 16 is 25. (25 represents the hypotenuse). The square root of 25 is 5. Therefore, the ratio is written 3:4:5. Let's try it:

1, 4, 916 4 - 1 = 3 9 - 4 = 5 16 - 9 = 7

These are the steps in Masonry. They are the steps in the winding stairs, which leads to the Middle Chamber, and they are the number of brethren that form the number of Master Masons necessary to open a lodge of:

Master Masons: 3 Fellow Crafts: 5 Entered Apprentices: 7

The essence of the 47th Problem of Euclid is about the importance of establishing an architecturally true (correct) foundation based on the use of the square. Why is this so important to speculative Masons who only have a symbolic square and not the actual square of the operative Mason? The 47th Problem of Euclid is the mathematical ratio (the knowledge) that allows a Master Mason to "Square his square when it gets out of square".

The knowledge of how to form a perfect square without the possibility of error has been accounted of the highest importance in the art of building from the time of the *Harpedonaptae*. *Harpedonaptae*, literally translated, means "rope stretchers" or "rope fasteners" of ancient Egypt (long before King Solomon's Temple was built).

They were architectural specialists who were called in to lay out the foundation lines of buildings. They were highly skilled and relied on astronomy (the stars) as well as mathematical calculations in order to form perfect square angles for each building.

In the Berlin museum is a deed, written on leather, dating back to 2000 B.C. (long before Solomon's time), which tells of the work of these rope stretchers.

Historically, a building's cornerstone was laid in the Northeast corner of the building. Why in the Northeast?

The ancient builders first laid out the North and South lines by observation of the stars and the sun—especially the North Star, which they believed at that time to be fixed in the sky. Only after laying out a perfect North and South line could they use the square to establish a perfect East and West line for their foundations.

The 47th Problem of Euclid established those true East and West lines, so the rope stretchers could ascertain a perfect 90-degree angle to the North-South line which they established using the stars.

If you would like to perform this yourself, it is quite easy... and once you get the necessary pieces together, would be a great show-and-tell educational instruction piece within your lodge.

Unlike the *Harpedonaptae*, you will have no way to establish true North and South... unless you use a compass. But a compass is not necessary for this demonstration.

You will need four thin sticks that are strong enough to stick in soft soil, 40 inches of string, and a black magic marker.

- 1. Place your **first** stick flat on the ground so that its ends point North and South.
- 2. Next, take a string (it's much more unwieldy if you use rope) and tie knots in it 3 inches apart. This will divide the string into 12 equal divisions. Tie the two ends of the string together (this is your 12th knot ... again, remember that from knot-to-knot must be 3 inches apart). The divisions between knots must be correct and equal or it will not work. Your string's total length is 36 inches. After you've tied the end-to-end knot, you may cut off the excess 4 inches of string. If you have more than 4 inches left over or less than 4 inches, you need to re-measure the lengths between the knots. Your string is now circular in shape and has 12 knots and 12 divisions.
 - Note: The Operative Masons of old used rope; however, because much of the length of the rope is within the knot, if you use rope, you must use a longer piece, measure each division, tie your knot, and then measure the next 3 inch division <u>before</u> you cut the length of rope, instead of marking the entire rope while it is lying flat and then tying your knots.
- 3. Stab your **second** stick in the ground near either end of your **North-South** stick and arrange a knot at the stick. Stretch three divisions away from it in any direction (9 inches) and insert the **third** stick in the ground, then place the **fourth** stick so that it falls on the knot between the 4-part and the 5-part division (12 inches). This forces the creation of a 3:4:5 right triangle. The angle between the 3 units and the 4 units is, of necessity, a square or right angle.
- 4. Now move your **third** and **fourth** sticks until they become a right angle (90 degrees) to your **North** -South stick.

Congratulations! You now have not only the ability to square your square, but to lay a geometrically correct cornerstone for your new foundation.

The Forty-Seventh Problem of Euclid in Today's World

With this simple geometric 3:4:5 ratio of how to create a 90-degree Right Angle, Man can reach out into space and measure the distance of the stars, in light years. He can survey land, mark off boundaries and construct every single thing on earth. He can build homes, churches and buildings, and with the knowledge of this simple ratio, he can begin digging on opposite sides of a mountain and dig a straight tunnel through the center of it that meets exactly at the center. He can navigate the oceans and be able to locate himself in the middle of the water, and is able to calculate how far he has come and how much farther he must go.

The 47th Problem of Euclid teaches each of us not only to be general lovers of the arts and sciences, but to stand in awe of the God given knowledge with which you can take a piece of string and 4 sticks, and be able to find your way home ... from anywhere on Earth, on the Sea, or in the Heavens.

It represents such a perfect symbol of Freemasonry, encompassing both arts and sciences, that the simple knowledge of it demands a breathtaking awe to which we may only bow our heads in reverence at the perfection, the universality and the infinite wisdom of that which has been given to us by God.

With knowledge of this simple geometric ratio, the word "Eureka!" almost palls in expressing the fundamental powers which our Creator has bestowed upon us.

In Memoriam

Bro. Allen Linwood Pitts, Jr., PM

March 10, 1934 — April 13, 2022



We knew it was coming, but that never softens the blow enough. On April 13, our Past Master Allen Pitts laid down his working tools, having survived his wife Linda, his parents and his sister. Bro. Pitts leaves children Melissa, Allen III (Trey) and Gray Lodge No. 329's Secretary and Past Master, Darrin Pitts.

Bro. Pitts was raised in Dallas, Texas where he was a top football recruit. He played at Highland Park high school before attending and graduating from what was then Sewanee Military Academy (now St. Andrews-Sewanee School in Tennessee, where he was named All-Mid-South running back in 1953.

Bro. Pitts went on to serve and play football for the Marine Corps until his honorable discharge in 1957, after which he moved to Houston where he met his wife, Linda. In 1969, Allen began working for Leyendecker Homes and built a 45-year career in new home sales, always winning top sales awards with the Greater Houston Builders Association's Sales & Marketing Council.

Just as quickly as he must have rushed past opposing linemen, Bro. Pitts rushed through the degrees in Masonry in record time: initiated on October 27, 1971; passed on December 2 and raised on December 31, 1971, all in Gray Lodge No. 329. Allen was a 32-degree Scottish Rite Mason and recently received his Grand Lodge 50-year service award from his son, Bro. Darrin Pitts. He advanced through the officer line and served as WM of Gray Lodge in 1976-77, and became an Endowed Member in 2004. In 2011, he received the Lodge's Golden Trowel Award. Bro. Pitts was also a 50-year Shriner and member of the Arabia Shrine. He was laid to his eternal rest with Masonic honors on April 19, 2022.
