Toleration in Masonry

Masonry inculcates civic patriotism and endeavors to strongly impress the importance of that public virtue upon the mind of every initiate; but chief among the more virtues, which the Order strives to keep ever present in the hearts of its candidates and members, is that of toleration. Toleration is that broad-mindedness which both prompts and enables a man to regard every other man as his peer, and entitled equally with himself to his individual opinions and sentiments regarding matters political, philosophical and religious.

Tolerance is that spirit of unselfishness which leads a man to recognize that each person sees things from his own viewpoint, and to admit that it is always possible for himself to be wrong and the other right. It is that kindliness of thought which prompts a man to respect the opinions of his fellows as if they might some day become his own.

Toleration is that charitable judgment upon the actions, the conduct and even the foibles of others which each man would wish passed upon his own, and which concedes that another may be honest at heart even though wrong or mistaken in his opinion or conclusion.

The practical object of Masonry has been defined to be "the physical and moral amelioration and intellectual and spiritual improvement of individuals and society." Society can be improved only as the constituent individuals are made better; and Masonry seeks to accomplish this by inducing in each individual consciousness a deeper and stronger personal responsibility and a higher and keener appreciation of the things of moral and intellectual worth. This, my brethren, is character building, and this is the ultimate object and aim of Masonry. It is that our system of philosophy takes the homely and practical operation of building a structure – a temple – as a symbol, by means of which to illustrate, to those who have eyes to see and ears to hear, those great truths and virtues which woven into the warp and woof of life by practice and experience, cloth man with a garment of beauty and honor, and polish and adorn his true character.

The cornerstone of the Masonic structure is Truth, which is declared to be a divine attribute and the foundation of every virtue. From this cornerstone extends the foundation walls constructed of the moral virtues and intellectual excellencies, and like the foundation of the metaphoric of the City of Revelation "garnished with all manner of precious stones," chief among which are Temperance, Fortitude, Prudence, Justice, Brotherly Love, Relief, Toleration, and Patriotism. And as the physical structure rises secure and faultless on its foundation of solid stones, so Masonry undertakes to erect the foundation of these great virtues, in each individual consciousness, the Temple of Character: that temple wherein each must dwell and serve, until, perfected by the processes of God's alchemy, sweetened by suffering and sanctified by love, he is prepared to enter in, through the gate over which is inscribed, "Holiness and to the Lord," into the city, made without hands, eternal in the heavens, in which there is no temple, "for the Lord God Almighty and the Lamb are the temple of it," (Rev. 21:22.)

Masonry instructs every entrant, "as a citizen, you are to be quiet and peaceable subject, true to your government, and just to your country; you are not to countenance disloyalty or rebellion,

but patiently submit to legal authority, and to conform with cheerfulness to the government of the country in which you live."

Masonic toleration does not in the least imply any obligation to condone wrong doing or the commission of crime either by Masons or others, for Masonry undertakes to teach men what is right, just and true; and this field of toleration extends to only to those who are trying to follow these precepts and not to those are knowingly or willfully violating them. Diversity of opinion in a country where there is free thought with respect to lawful methods, which is not only lawful but is right and desirable, makes for advancement in culture and achievement; and it is such diversity of opinion that Masonic toleration has in view of inculcating respect and regard for the views and sentiments of those who may differ from us concerning manners or matters of life; but all of this applied only to such matters, circumstances and conditions as are in themselves beyond the pale of lawful obedience, they cease to have any claim upon Masonry for any of its privileges or benefits. Above all, Masonry teaches obedience to lawful regulations and duly constituted authorities; and in no sense approves disrespect, violation or nullification of proper governmental regulations.

Men genuinely imbued with the principle of Toleration are qualified to lead the people in their struggle upward, and those not appointed to lead know how to follow and serve in every movement for Justice, Right, and Truth.
